#### Dear Friends:

At the half year mark, we would like to thank you, our donors and volunteers, for your interest and support of our work on behalf of the Maya people. Thus far this year you have made it possible for us to successfully continue all ongoing MEF scholarship programs and projects in Guatemala, Mexico, and Belize and to serve more than 500 Maya students, 186 of them studying at university level. In addition, special grants have allowed us to support the work of CIRMA, the leading social science research center in Antigua, and to also help with three special projects (in Guatemala, rebuilding a crumbling wall around our partner FEPMaya's office in Mixco, and helping to complete a second floor at an educational center in Cotzal; in Belize, fixing student dormitories at Tumul K'in Learning Center). In January, volunteers under the direction of Randhi Wilson worked tirelessly to make the English Language Program a great success. Due to several organizations and individuals deciding to sponsor MEF scholarships this year, we now have sponsorships for a total of 46 Maya university students. Each such funding commitment gives the students and us great encouragement. Thank you.

Our gratitude goes also to our nonprofit partners who help us carry out our mission of educational advancement for the Maya people. Without their dedication and collaboration, we would have to establish costly administrative branches. We keep in regular contact with our partners and students and make frequent visits. You'll see photos of some of our recent visits to Guatemala and Chiapas on the back of this letter.

Regarding our nonprofit profile, we are pleased to announce that MEF has received the highest-level Platinum seal of transparency from GuideStar. In addition, we once again passed the auditors' annual test required for U.S. public charities. Every year MEF must show broad public support in the form of many different, individual contributions from donors large and small. As you can imagine, this is not an easy feat. Your continued support is therefore vital.

MEF donors share our belief that it makes sense to help indigenous people in their own countries where they are in great distress socially and economically. Their difficult situations can only be improved if they have a path to advance in their society. With higher education levels, they have a better chance at finding rewarding work in their homelands. MEF scholarships help young, hard-working Maya students succeed. The students deeply appreciate the scholarship opportunities and ask us to thank you. They understand that it is your support that makes their scholarships possible.
